Planning for 2019

Planning is underway for next year and in the next few weeks we will begin looking at our class structure for 2019. Next year we will have 18 grades (one more than this year) - three classes each for Preps, Grades 1, 2 and 3 and two classes each for Grades 4, 5 and 6. Teachers at each level use their professional judgment and their in-depth knowledge of each student to create class groupings. They spend many hours carefully considering the academic, social and emotional needs of all students as well as taking into account gender balance, friendships and class dynamics. Each year we provide the opportunity for parents to put in writing any information about their child, that may be helpful as the teachers work carefully through this process. Please note it is not possible to make multiple requests that affect the placement of other students, or to request specific teachers, but it is information specific to your child that will help us in their class placement. The Legend She Is. **By Josiah,**

The W.S. Cox Plate is a Moonee Valley Racing Club Group 1 Thoroughbred horse race for horses aged three years old. Horses must be under weight for age conditions. The race is over a distance of 2040 metres, held at Moonee Valley Racecourse, Melbourne, Australia in late October. But do the horses really enjoy it?

Winx being the only horse to win it four times in a row has created history throughout the past few years winning it in, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018.

Earning about 20 million from the Cox Plate alone, Winx has also won 29 straight group one races. In the 2016 she won the Cox plate by 8 body lengths, a pretty amazing effort for a horse race like that.

Winx was born on the 14th of September 2011, at Coolmore Stud in the Hunter Valley, N.S.W Weighing in at 530kg she was lightly framed but has developed considerably in the last two years and is now powerful and muscular. Averaging \$454,600 for every star after 36 races the owners would have a lot of money on their hands

Winx was inducted into the Australian Hall of Fame in 2017. Alongside Bradman and others, Winx is now among the Australian sporting greats. She is the only horse to win the Cox plate four times in a row.

It is a good break in the middle between Easter and Christmas, so the kids can just take a night off homework and school to have fun with their friends and family, maybe even meet someone new. Who doesn't want a good break to release the stress of school or homework? So, with the information I have gathered, I can draw to the conclusion that the spooky season Halloween, has a scary history and aim but is a fun way to have a break off work. People need to take more care around roads though, but Halloween defiantly has the benefits of teaching kids manners.
